### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHERS

### ANNUAL DATA CHECK

Thank you to everyone that completed the recent annual data check either online or returning the paper copies. This information is extremely important and must be always up to date. If any of your child's information or contact details change throughout the year, please ensure you inform the school office. For those that signed up to Parentsportal you can log in and update the details when it is necessary.

### PE

It is helpful if children come to school in their PE kits on PE days. PE days are as follow:

### PARENTS EVENING APPOINTMENTS

This year the class teacher will call you between Monday 4<sup>th</sup> and Friday 15<sup>th</sup> October for a 10 minute conversation. If there is a date and time that suits you best please let us know.

### PUPIL ABSENCE

We are required to keep attendance information for all pupils. If your child is going to be absent or have a change of schedule (e.g. going home with a friend) please notify the school office by telephone or email at the earliest opportunity. If leaving a voicemail, please ensure you clearly state your child's name and reason for being absent. It is an Aberdeenshire Council policy that we are only able to accept these changes/notification from the registered parent/carer. If your child has an appointment and is going to need a school lunch, please ensure you let us know before hand as our lunch order needs to be in by 9:30am each morning to ensure that your child gets a school lunch. Thank you in advance for your co-operation with this matter.

### COVID GUIDELINES

Thank you to all parents/carers for maintaining 2m distance and wearing face coverings at the school gates. We are required to remind you that if your child displays any of the main symptoms or the extended symptoms of Covid-19, they should not attend school until they have received a negative PCR test result. Please let us know of any Covid-19 related absences as soon as possible, as we have procedures to put in place quickly.

We would like to remind parents that we finish between 3.05 and 3:15 to try to provide a staggered pick up.

### FLU IMMUNISATIONS

Flu nasal immunisations are scheduled to take place on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> November. The school nursing team will be wearing full PPE. If you have not returned the permission forms your child will not receive the nasal flu immunisation.

### SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR

The Scholastic book fair will be in school from Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October until 12<sup>th</sup> October. All classes will be given the opportunity to have a look at the selection of books on offer. Unfortunately, we won't be able to have our open evening this year and provide parents with the opportunity to view the book fair. Instead, children can complete a wish list to bring home and discuss. If you wish to buy from the book fair, we are kindly asking parents to pay online this year. We will be sending out the book fair leaflet and some further information on this shortly. There will be a QR code provided that will allow you to make your payment easily.

The school will benefit from 50% commission of any book sales if we reach a target of £400 which will be used to purchase books for the school.

### Children's Eye Health & Sight - FREE EYE EXAMINATIONS

All children in Scotland are entitled to an annual free eye examination by a qualified Optometrist (Optician). These examinations are really important for checking the health of your children's eyes and for making sure that children get any help they may need to make the most of their vision. Sometimes children do not notice that one eye cannot see as well as the other and an eye examination can check to see if your child has any squints or 'lazy eyes' or if they need glasses. Vision can change over time so it is important to have checks regularly to see if there has been any change. The Optician will give a prescription for glasses for your child if they need it. There is no obligation to buy glasses from the same Optician. Your child is entitled to an NHS optical voucher to help cover the cost of glasses. If the glasses you choose costs more than the voucher, you will have to pay the difference. The Optician will explain this in more detail. We would encourage all parents to take their children to any high street Optician.
