PE/Outdoor Learning

Communication from School

Most of our communication is done via Groupcall/email. However, some communication may come home via school bags. Please ensure that you look out for forms etc coming home. An email will usually be sent to ask you to look out for the information coming home.

Can we kindly ask that you return all paperwork or reply to all communication promptly and by the date requested. Can we also ask that you ensure that any paperwork completed in full to ensure we don't have to send it home again.

Pupil Absence

Can we please remind parents that if your child is going to be absent from school or have a change of schedule (e.g. going home with a friend) please notify the school office by telephone (01651 267450) or email at the earliest opportunity. If leaving a voicemail, please ensure you clearly state your child's name and reason for being absent. If your child has an appointment first thing and is going to need a school lunch ordered, please ensure you let us know by 9:30am at the latest.

Can we also remind parents that if your child has been vomiting or has diarrhoea then they should stay off school for 48 hours after their last bout.



Parentsportal/Annual Data Check

We are delighted that most of our parents have registered for Parentsportal. The few that have not registered have been reminded to register with details of how to do so and we would really appreciate it if they could register as soon as possible.

The Annual Data Check is a requirement within all schools and will be issued once we have all parents registered on Parentsportal. In the past we have been able to send Annual Data Check forms home in school bags, however we can no longer do this due to GDPR.

The Annual Data Check is extremely important as it allows us to check that we hold up to date emergency contact information and medical information for your child/children.
